## 2015 Meadowcroft Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley

Shining fresh red fruit, spice, rainy-day earth—and a sophisticated, feminine, classic finesse—recommend this Russian River Valley Pinot Noir to any fan of the grape, Old World or New. Lively and pleasant early, it develops steadily in the glass over more than two hours.

The enduring core of the aroma profile is fruit and spice; earth and floral character develop later and are likely to be elaborated with time in the cellar. More central to the character of this wine: it is drinkable, round, integrated; there are no rough edges or notable flaws. A fine acidic structure is overlaid with an expressive bouquet of typical aromas, followed up with a long, gentle, ethereal finish.

**Complexity:** Beyond satisfactory, but not the key virtue of the wine **Balance:** Very noteworthy; perfectly proportionate impressions from the acid, alcohol and aromas; even, structured, smoothly integrated **Intensity:** Very good; expressive with clear and distinct aromas **Character:** Goes from fruity/wet-earthy, to perfumy and round **Typicity:** Unmistakable Pinot Noir with New World depth and Old World finesse; quite versatile, it's food-friendly but doesn't require it


