Independent Wine Evaluation

2012 "Wisdom" Cabernet Sauvignon, Pedroncelli Winery

This is an elegant and balanced, cooler-weather style Dry Creek Valley Cabernet Sauvignon. Though alcohol reaches 14.4%, there was sufficient perceived acidity to draw some comparisons to northerly Bordeaux.

The nose shows spice, red fruit, and a touch of leather. Aromas unfold slowly and with great balance and evenness. The palate shows menthol, cedar, dry grass, and darker fruit. Tart acidity is refreshing and food-friendly, and tannins are gentle but build up on the palate over time.

After forty-five minutes, the profile of the nose moves in the direction of the palate and the two show darker fruit, more menthol, anise and dry herbs. In the end, gentle vanilla and raspberry round out and soften the palate.

Complexity: Above average but not the wine's core virtue; it shows a variety of spice, fruit and herbal notes, with satisfactory differentiation Balance: Nice integration of aromas, especially early on; menthol and herbs stood out with time; alcohol, acidity and tannin are well integrated **Intensity:** Aromas and flavors are expressive (some more than others),

but overall the wine is more elegant in style

Character: Despite quality, lacks clear, distinctive personality

Typicity: Good; varietally typical and representative of its appellation
