Independent Wine Evaluation

"Anniversary Cuvée" Red Blend, Meadowcroft Wines

Everything about the wine is fresh and youthful, from fleshy plum fruit to abundant eucalyptus, to green garden herbs and mossy-woody aromas. Black licorice or anise, cinnamon, new leather, cigar box and creamy dark chocolate give refinement to what is primarily a fruity wine.

After an hour's exposure, cedar-spice French oak and the red end of the fruit profile pivot into a long, sweet vanilla-raspberry finish. Though a Left Bank Bordeaux blend made in French oak with a restrained style of winemaking, do not expect earth or dust here. The grapes assert their California provenance and call for a thick, seared, peppery steak.

Complexity: Shows a broad set of aromas—but laterally, less in the sense of dimension and structure; it's intricate, yet level and polished. **Balance:** Good: 14.5% alcohol propels the aromas without revealing itself and, with gentle acid and soft tannin, allows a silky, long finish **Expressiveness:** Evenly aromatic and flavorful across two hours Character: Fresh, spritely, round, sophisticated with soft edges Typicity: Typical varietal flavors, with unexpected silkiness


