Independent Wine Evaluation

2013 Decimus Pinot Noir, Tithe Wines, Los Carneros, Napa Valley

Pinot Noir can be so delicate as to be overlooked; this one belts out from the glass from the first moment. Full, round and flavorful, it shows Rioja-like spice, leather and brown sugar early on—backed by a deep swell of fresh cherry, stewed strawberry and orange marmalade.

It's not overly New World in style, however. With some oxygen, a cycle of perfumy floral-and-spice potpourri notes keeps things interesting for a couple of hours. Subtle wet clay and black olive notes suggest earth character will develop with time in the cellar. A bit warm and powerful for some, this Pinot is nonetheless even-keeled and full of the floral, fleshy, organic feminine character serious Pinot collectors cherish.

Complexity: Very good; quite a variety of distinct aromas **Balance:** The alcohol will be a notch high for some Pinot fans; however, we did not find it to be problematic; well-balanced overall **Intensity:** Very good; no part of its broad aroma profile is understated **Character:** Memorably deep, feminine, round, soothing, warm, organic **Typicity:** Indisputably Pinot-esque, but fuller than typical Carneros; at times, more like meaty Grand Cru Burgundy from the Cote de Nuits




